Children attend camp during the day while parents enjoy their own plans in the city.

Students with a Local Guardian

Students may attend without a parent if they have a suitable local guardian in Shanghai.

A strong fit for families already living in Shanghai and looking for a structured Chinese day camp.

HOW WE GROUP STUDENTS

Students are grouped thoughtfully by both age and Chinese level to create a better academic and social fit.

CHINESE LEVEL PLACEMENT

Within each age group, students are placed into:

- Beginner
- Intermediate
- Advanced

GROUP SIZE

- Chinese lessons: up to 8 students
- Cultural activities: up to 20 students



Program Options

For students who want a more immersive day camp experience with both Chinese learning and cultural activities.

- Standard Price: RMB 10,800 / 2 weeks



Before You Travel to China

A little preparation goes a long way.

Before making final plans, we recommend checking:

- Passport validity
- Visa or entry requirements, if applicable
- Flight and accommodation confirmations
- Your child's camp confirmation details
- Simple daily contact plans for the family

Payments, Transport, and Essential Apps

MOBILE PAYMENT

In China, mobile payment is part of everyday life. Before departure, it helps to:

- Set up **Alipay** or **WeChat** Pay
- Link a parent's bank card if possible
- Notify your bank before international travel
- Bring a physical bank card as backup



GETTING AROUND SHANGHAI

Families typically move around using:



Metro

Fast, frequent, and affordable. The best way to navigate the city.



Taxi

Budget-friendly and plentiful. Download Didi app for easy hailing.



Walking

Recommended for short distances to soak in the local atmosphere.



Airport Transfers

Seamless connections via taxi, metro, or bus to the city center

USEFUL APPS

Before departure, families may also want to think about:

- Payment
- Maps
- Translation
- Transport
- Messaging

INTERNET READINESS

Before departure, families may also want to think about:

- International roaming
- ESIM or local data options
- How parents and children will stay in contact during the day

Weather, Clothing, and Daily Comfort



SUMMER IN SHANGHAI

Shanghai summers are typically hot, humid, and sometimes rainy. Families should be ready for:

- Warm mornings
- Humidity
- Strong afternoon heat
- Occasional showers



WHAT TO WEAR

We recommend:

- Light, breathable summer clothing
- A hat or other sun protection
- Comfortable walking shoes



USEFUL DAILY ITEMS

- Refillable water bottle
- Sunscreen
- Tissues or hand sanitizer
- Mosquito repellent
- Regular medication, if needed



TRAVEL TIPS

- Keep passports, money, and medication in hand luggage
- Make copies of important documents
- Pack one small bag with first-day essentials

Accommodation & Family Logistics



CHOOSING WHERE TO STAY

We recommend choosing accommodation with:

- A practical commute to Zhongshan Park campus
- Easy access to food and daily necessities
- A family-friendly neighborhood
- A budget level that fits your travel style

WHAT MAKES A STAY MORE CONVENIENT

Families often appreciate accommodation with:

- Walking distance or a short commute to campus
- Nearby cafés, restaurants, and convenience stores
- Access to laundry facilities
- An area that feels easy to navigate day by day

MEALS AND DAILY BUDGET

Depending on accommodation and program:

- Breakfast may be included
- Lunch is included in the full-day program
- Families should budget separately for dinners and personal outings

Catch up on work or personal errands
